

Cmdr. Charles P. Ridgway JR. USN (Ret.)

Chuck Ridgway is a retired, nuclear trained, U.S. Navy surface warfare and reserve Africa foreign area officer. A native of Eagle, Colorado, he is a graduate of Carnegie-Melon University where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering. He holds a Master of Public Administration from the University of Colorado at Denver and was awarded the Command and Staff Diploma from the U.S. Naval War College at Newport, RI.

Ridgway served as communications officer USS Monterey (CG 61); main propulsion division officer, USS Nimitz (CVN 68); and, through the personnel exchange program to the German Navy, assistant navigator, FGS Lubeck (F214).



From 2003 to 2022, Ridgway served as a navy reserve officer with billets in a variety of units supporting U.S. Naval Forces Africa and U.S. Africa Command. He deployed to Africa on

numerous occasions in support of the Africa Partnership Station initiative and exercises. In 2014 he performed the assessment of the African Maritime Law Enforcement Partnership with Ghana while embarked in USNS Spearhead (JHSV-1). He also acted as U.S. Naval Forces Africa Liaison Officer embarked in Belgian Navy Ship, Godetia during her 2016 West Africa Maritime Capacity Building deployment. He retired from the Navy with the rank of Commander in June 2022.

In civilian employment Ridgway was a NATO official for ten years working in operational analysis at NATO's Joint Analysis and Lessons Learned Centre in Lisbon, Portugal. Since 2016 he has worked as a consultant for a number of international development organizations such as Africa Development Promise, Engineers Without Borders USA, Scope International, One Earth Future Foundation's, Oceans Beyond Piracy and Stable Seas programs, the UN Office of Drugs and Crime's Global Maritime Crime Programme and the Defense Security Cooperation Agency's Governance. He has also taught graduate-level summer courses on Monitoring & Evaluation for Regis University's International Development Practice program. In his spare time, he is a substitute teacher in the Denver Public Schools.

A fluent speaker of German, French and Portuguese, Ridgway is the winner of the 2024 Chief of Naval Operations Naval History Essay Contest, Rising History Category.
