The boat remains in overhaul at Pearl Harbour Naval Shipyard but has now left drydock and is pierside. The overhaul has not been impacted by the government shutdown with retesting of equipment after refurbishment going well and only a low percentage of equipment needing retest.

The ship is on track to complete overhaul in July of next year and will be the first Block III Virginia Class to complete that milestone.

The Association supported the boat in October by helping procure supplies for a family Halloween Party and facilitating the boat's participation in a Summit County School District Veterans Day celebration.

Also in October LCDR. Evan Parrish relieved CDR. Eric Stromme as XO. CDR. Stromme is headed to PACFLT for his shore tour as Deputy Executive Assistant to Commander, US Pacific Fleet. In promotion news, in August, three of COLORADO's First Class Petty Officers were selected for advancement to Chief Petty Officer.

Finally, there is much speculation as to where COLORA-DO will go after the overhaul. While the original plan was for the boat to return to Groton, there is a possibility that they could be homeported in Perth, Australia as part of the AUKUS agreement. The current administration is undergoing a review of the AUKUS policy, and nothing will be determined before that review is complete. There is also a possibility that COLORADO will remain at Pearl Harbour.

Time will tell!

Support the Pay Our Troops Act (H.R. 5401)!
THE ISSUE

During a government shutdown, members of the Armed Service are required to report for duty, but remain unpaid until Congress passes a budget and the government reopens. The Pay Our Troops Act (H.R. 5401) ensures that members of the military receive pay and benefits during a shutdown. The bill protects members of the military, including the Coast Guard, as well as U.S. Department of Defense civilian employees and contractors who directly support the Armed Services, until regular appropriations are enacted or until January 1, 2027.

THE SOLUTION

On September 16th, 2025, Congresswoman Jen Kiggans (VA-02) reintroduced the Pay Our Troops Act (H.R. 5401) to address the need for assured pay, allowances, and benefits for the Armed Forces including Coast Guard personnel, during a lapse in government funding. The Navy League of the United States, on behalf of our 30,000 members across the country, ask Members of Congress to support this bill.

WHY YOU SHOULD TAKE ACTION

"The men and women who put their lives on the line to defend our country should never go without a paycheck," says Congresswoman Jen Kiggans, a Navy veteran and member of the House Armed Services Committee. "Our servicemembers should never have to worry about missing a paycheck because Washington can't do its job. As we continue working to keep the government open, my bill will give our troops the financial certainty they deserve."

Sea Cadet Update

Lexington Division and Training Ship Colorado cadets continue to exemplify leadership, service, and resilience through hands-on training and community engagement. From field operations to public event support, cadets are developing essential life and leadership skills that reflect the Navy's core values of Honor, Courage, and Commitment.


In August, the cadets were at the Condie Farm in Longmont for an immersive field operations weekend. Cadets participated in a comprehensive safety briefing before setting up camp and engaging in hands-on exercises, including medical training, controlled access simulations, radio communications, and night missions. Between field games and mission drills, cadets demonstrated teamwork, adaptability, and hard work—embracing tent life with enthusiasm, enjoying hearty chow, and maintaining high morale throughout the demanding weekend.

In September, the cadets proudly volunteered at the Loveland Air Show, supporting the U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds and The Airshow Network. Over two full days, more than 40 cadets and 10 adult volunteers contributed a total of 665 service hours, assisting with ticket scanning, credentialing, and guest escorting in the corporate chalets, box seats and VIP flightline areas. Despite the hot weather and long hours, the cadets persevered and earned the respect of event organizers. The Airshow Network made a generous donation to the unit in recognition of their exemplary service.



October brought the cadets back to home base at Buckley Space Force Base, and we also got back to basics. Cadets were placed in squads and focused on drilling, radio operations, rope tying, and land navigation. The squads competed against each other, earning points in each area.. Sea Cadets also enjoyed a spirited game of Jeopardy, with squad


